Dear Families,

Welcome to the first nursery newsletter of the new session! A very warm welcome to all our new children and families joining us this year, and a heartfelt welcome back to those returning. We are excited for the year ahead and look forward to working in partnership with you to make this a happy, nurturing, and fun-filled experience for your child.

Settling In

The first few weeks of term are all about helping children settle into nursery life. Our staff team are supporting children as they get to know new routines, make friends, and explore the learning environment both indoors and outdoors. Please remember, every child settles in their own way and at their own pace, and we are here to support both children and families through this transition.

Drop-Off and Pick-Up

To support smooth transitions in the mornings and 1.15pm drop off, we continue to use our drop-off and go system. This approach helps children settle more quickly and reduces upset at the start of the day.

From 4pm onwards at pick-up time, families are welcome to come into the playroom to collect their child. This provides a lovely opportunity to see the play environment and have a brief catch-up with staff.

Through conversations and questionnaires in session 2024–25, families told us this system worked well, so we are continuing it this year. We will also keep gathering feedback throughout the session to make positive improvements where needed.

Learning and Play

This term, we will be focusing on building relationships, exploring our nursery environment, and encouraging children to share their interests. Through play, children will be developing early skills in communication, problem-solving, creativity, and independence. Outdoor learning will also be a big part of our days, so please ensure your child has suitable clothing for all weathers. Watch out for our 'Sharing the Learning' sways which highlight children's monthly learning.



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Working Together

Strong partnerships with families are at the heart of what we do. We will keep in touch and share children's learning in a variety of ways, including:

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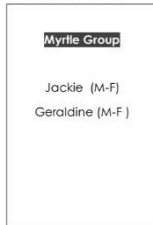
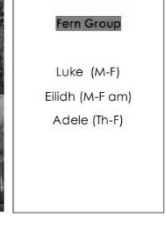
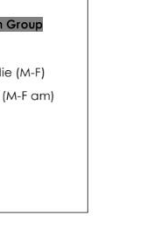
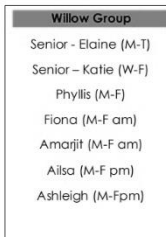


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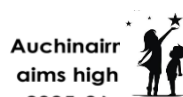
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Meet Team Auchinairn EYC Keyworkers

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Friendship Code

At nursery, we help children learn the importance of keeping themselves and others safe by following our friendship code. We use our SHANARRI wellbeing buddies and SIMOA to explore what this means, and we regularly reinforce these ideas both verbally and visually with the children.

Alongside this, we follow our Positive Behaviour policy, which you can find in our policy folder.

Our Friendship Code is:

- Healthy Henry say – “I share my feelings”
- Achieving Andrew says – “I try my very best”
- Nurtured Nora says – “I have kind hands and feet”

Celebrating Achievements

At nursery, we love to celebrate the amazing things our children achieve. In our corridor, we have an Achievement Board and a Star of the Week tree. We would be delighted if you could share your child's successes with us by adding photos, certificates, or comments to their Learning Journal. Our Little Chatters Matter Children's Rights Committee will then print and display these on the board for everyone to enjoy.

Each week, we also celebrate s Star of the Week. Children receive a certificate from staff for showing our Friendship Code, making safe choices, and being a kind and helpful friend. Certificates are placed on the tree, ready for children to collect and proudly take home.



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Important Information

Absence Reporting

Please contact our office on 0141 955 2289 if your child will be absent from nursery. If we have not been notified, we will call you.

Sickness Policy

If your child has sickness and/or diarrhoea, please keep them at home for 48 hours after the last episode to help prevent the spread of illness. This also protects staff, as they must follow the same rule, which can impact service delivery.

Medication

If your child requires medication during their session, it must have a prescription label, and a consent form must be completed with staff. Please allow time at drop off to arrange this.

Session Times & Doors

Please arrive and collect your child on time for their session.

Doors open at 8.00am and close at 6.00pm

Session times:

8.00am-12.45pm, 1.15pm-6.00pm, or 8.00am-5.30/6.00pm

Clothing & Belongings

- Velcro shoes wherever possible.
- Label all items of clothing, this will ensure a swift return!
- Please no toys from home– children get upset, when others bring things from home as they have been told they are not allowed. No toys mean no unnecessary upset.
- Ensure children wear suitable clothing for outdoors, we love to explore in all weathers!



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Car Parking

When dropping off or collecting your child, please park considerately. Our car park is shared with other community centre users, so it's important that spaces and access are kept clear. Please also note that pavement parking may now result in a fine of £100.

Treat Fund

Thank you to everyone who has already contributed to the Treat Fund. Families are encouraged to pay £2.00 per week and all contributions are greatly appreciated. This can be made weekly, monthly, termly or yearly. Linda and Fiona, our admin team are happy to help with collecting payments.
